

Quincy, IL is nestled on the state's western edge of the Mississippi River. Our location on the Mississippi River allows for 12-month barge traffic. Quincy is home to over 1,500 truck power units. We are at the crossroad of 3 major national highways. Quincy has 2 national freight options with trains available daily, and a regional airport with 7,089 ft. runway.
